





In 2023, Independence Health System opened an 18,000 square foot medical facility at the Wide Waters Plaza.

The total estimated annual impact in spending related to Independence Square in Connells-ville is nearly \$14 million — \$7.3 million in direct expenses at the facility and \$6.4 million in direct ripple effect in the region.

This medical facility has resulted in about 92 jobs, 44 in direct employees at the facility – including 20 to 25 new positions — and 48 through indirect relationships.

The average salary for non-physician, non-advanced practitioner positions is \$47,000.
